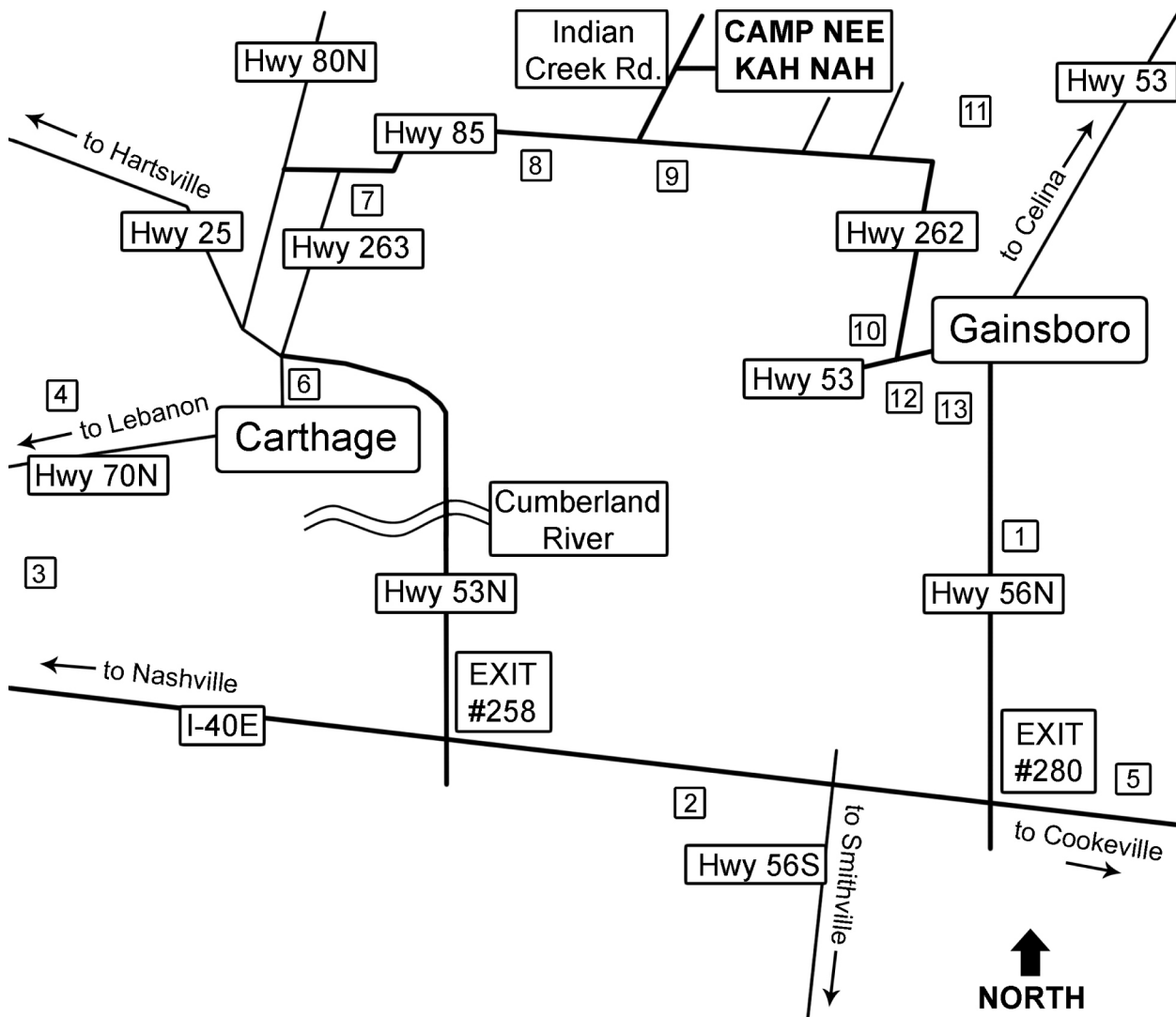


# GIRL SCOUTS OF MIDDLE TENNESSEE: CAMP NEE KAH NAH



1. From Exit #280 to Gainesboro is 16.5 miles
2. From Nashville to Exit #280 is 68 miles
3. From Nashville to Lebanon is 30 miles
4. From Lebanon to Carthage is 20 miles
5. From Cookeville to Exit #280 is 10 miles
6. From Carthage to Hwy 263/25 split is 2.5 miles
7. From Hwy 263/25 split to Hwy 85 is 5 miles
8. From Hwy 263/85 junction to Indian Creek Rd. is 12.5 miles
9. Richmond Church of Christ
10. From Hwy 53/262 junction to Indian Creek Rd. is 6 miles
11. Fairgrounds
12. From Hwy 56N to Hwy 262 is 0.5 miles
13. Courthouse

# DIRECTIONS TO CAMP NEE KAH NAH

632 Indian Creek Road

Camp Nee Kah Nah is located on Indian Creek Road in western Jackson County between Gainesboro and Carthage.

## **FROM I-40:**

- Take exit #280 and turn north toward Baxter/ Gainesboro.
- Go approximately 16.5 miles and turn left onto Highway 53 South into the town of Gainesboro.
- Go 0.8 miles and turn right onto Highway 262 West.
- After crossing over the Cumberland River, stay on Highway 262. You will pass the fairgrounds and Richmond Church of Christ.
- Start looking for Indian Creek Road.
- Turn right onto Indian Creek Road and go approximately 0.9 miles. The camp entrance is on your right at a gravel road and across an iron bridge.

## **FROM HARTSVILLE:**

- Take Highway 25 toward Carthage and turn left onto Highway 80.
- Go approximately 2.6 miles and turn right onto Highway 85.
- Go approximately 13.5 miles and turn left onto Indian Creek Road.
- Go approximately 0.9 miles and the camp entrance is on your right at a gravel road and across an iron bridge.

## **FROM LEBANON:**

- Take Highway 70 North to Carthage.
- Turn left onto Highway 25 and then right onto Highway 80.
- Go approximately 2.6 miles and turn right onto Highway 85.
- Go approximately 13.5 miles and turn left onto Indian Creek Road.
- Go approximately 0.9 miles and the camp entrance is on your right at a gravel road and across an iron bridge.
