

Camp Holloway is located on 76 acres in Millersville, Tennessee. It is named in honor of Josephine Groves Holloway, the first Black Girl Scout leader in Middle Tennessee, who was instrumental in creating this camp. Established as a camp for Black girls in 1952, today girls of all races, religions, and backgrounds gather at Camp Holloway to discover the fun, friendship, and power of girls together – just as Mrs. Holloway intended.

At Camp Holloway, groups can take part in a variety of outdoor adventures including archery, obstacle courses, rappelling and climbing towers, swimming, team adventure, and tree climbing. Camp Holloway is also home to one of the two summer resident camps.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP HOLLOWAY

From Nashville: (approx 40 minutes from downtown Nashville)

- Take I-65 NORTH to Exit 98 (Millersville/Springfield)
- Turn RIGHT onto Hwy 31W (traveling north)
- Travel 5.8 miles and turn LEFT onto S. Swift Road
- Turn RIGHT at the third street, Holloway Road
- Holloway Road dead ends into the camp
- Follow the drive to the front of Josephine’s Lodge

From Kentucky/Northern Tennessee:

- Take I-40W to I-65 SOUTH to Exit 98 (Millersville/Springfield)
- Turn LEFT onto Hwy 31W (traveling north)
- Travel 5.8 miles and turn LEFT onto S. Swift Road
- Turn RIGHT at the third street, Holloway Road
- Holloway Road dead ends into the camp
- Follow the drive to the front of Josephine’s Lodge
