Getting Started



Get ready to rally

Invite Cadette, Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts to serve as rally facilitators. They'll help share the responsibility — and their cookie expertise.

Get them started with this inspiring <u>video</u>.





Whole Group Activities



Embrace togetherness!

Bring on the fun with group activities at the start and end of your rally. You can:

- **Set the scene:** Welcome Girl Scouts and introduce the season, theme and mascot with a simple, customizable <u>script</u>.
- Get them moving: Play the "This or That" game shown in this video. Ask cookie season questions, like are they Team Samoas or Thin Mints? Is digital or booth marketing their favorite? Answers can be movements like jumps, claps or dance moves.
- Run a relay: Make your own relay race with cookie facts and a baton. You can even make it a bamboo baton in keeping with this year's theme.

Scent Booklet

Guess the Girl Scout Cookie™!

Learning about cookies is important and fun! In this game, Girl Scouts get a series of clues to guess the correct cookie. Play one-on-one or with a group.

Supplies:

- Clue Cards template
- Scissors
- Glue or tape
- · Optional: Small prizes for winners

Instructions for making clue sleeve:

- 1. Cut out game clue sleeve along dotted line.
- 2. Fold along solid lines and tape flap at the back to make an envelope that opens at the top and bottom.
- 3. Cut clue slips along dotted lines.
- 4. Insert one clue slip in the sleeve.

Instructions for game play:

- 1. Players take turns being the cookie expert.
- 2. The cookie expert reads clues one at a time to one or more players. Players guess which cookie is being described. Clues are revealed by pulling the slip down in the sleeve.
- 3. Players get points based on the clue's difficulty. Points are indicated with each clue. The player with the most points wins!

The nose knows

Did you know pandas have an amazing sense of smell? They hold bamboo up to their nose to decide if it's yummy enough to eat!

Invite Girl Scouts to take a cue from the mascot by creating a booklet with scents inspired by the cookies.

Supplies:

- Cookie Sense sheet
- Lip balms or oils scented like cookie ingredients (i.e. cocoa, mint, marshmallow, etc.) *Reminder: Be mindful of common allergies.

Instructions:

- 1. Volunteers place cookie-scented lip balms or essential oils at a scent booklet station. (Be mindful to avoid scents that may cause allergic reactions.)

 Scent suggestions: coconut, mint, lemon, chocolate, caramel, marshmallow or even butter.
- 2. Print Cookie Sense sheet.
- 3. Girl Scouts fold Cookie Sense sheet and apply the scent to the cookie that contains that ingredient.








COLOR

Some experts think the panda's distinct coloring helps it hide. Its white body and face disappear in snowy habitats. Its dark arms and legs camouflage it in shade.



BABY PANDAS

Newborn panda cubs are born pink, hairless and they can't see. They are about the size of a stick of butter. Panda mamas keep their babies close for the first month of their lives.



PLAY

Pandas love to roll and tumble. They also love to



DIET

Pandas spend a lot of time eating. Like, a lot. They spend 10-16 hours a day sniffing and crunching on food – mostly bamboo.



POTTY HABITS

Pandas poo 40 times a day and sometimes do handstands when they pee!




NAMING

Pandas are named in a Chinese ceremony when they are 100 days old. Our mascot is named Měi Lán, meaning beautiful orchid and wise lady.




JUNGLE QUEEN BUTTERFLIES

Once a year, over 400 species of butterflies visit the bamboo forest of southwestern China, where pandas live. It's like a butterfly explosion.



SCHISANDRA BERRIES

Efforts to save this superfood berry, and lessons on how to harvest it, have helped to save pandas' lives! Schisandra berry conservation has helped increase panda populations by 17%.



ENVIRONMENT

All pandas found in the wild live in bamboo forests high in the mountains of Southwest China.



Meet the Mascot — Spinning Panda Ring instructions Little Brownie

1 Print the <u>Panda Ring template</u>. Cut out a panda and punch a hole on its nose.



3 Punch a small hole in the ring band and put a brad through the panda nose hole and ring hole to attach. Spin and enjoy!







Optional Spinning Flower Ring for your Panda Friend

- 1 Cut pieces of colored paper into two-inch squares. Fold the paper into a triangle three times. Cut a curve into the open end of the triangle to make an ice cream cone shape.
- 2 Open it up to reveal a flower, and punch a small hole into the center.
- 3 Make a ring band by cutting strips of colored paper, sizing it to a finger, and taping in place. Punch a small hole in the ring band and put a brad through both the flower hole and ring hole. Now the flower spins, too!







Pin the panda


Invite Girl Scouts to make special panda SWAPS, which stands for "Special Whatchamacallits Affectionately Pinned Somewhere." Encourage them to exchange these small tokens of friendship with one another.

Supplies:

- Panda SWAPS template
- Cotton ball or pompom
- Clothespin
- Scissors
- Glue
- Optional: Googly eyes

Instructions:

- 1. Print the Panda SWAPS template.
 Cut out the panda along the dotted line.
- 2. Glue the cotton ball or pompom to the belly of the panda. Glue on the googly eyes if you have them.
- 3. Glue the panda to the clothespin and swap with a Girl Scout friend.





Instructions for Scavenger Hunt:

- 1. Insert images of rewards into the Scavenger Hunt Map.
- 2. Print images of corresponding rewards and place them around the room (ex. under a chair, behind a door, etc.). You can make them progressively harder to find to make the game more challenging.
- 3. Girl Scouts color in or mark the circle next to the item on the Scavenger Hunt Map when they locate the images of the rewards.

You can give a prize to every Girl Scout who completes the game.






Rockin' goal reminders

Teach entrepreneurs how to set a goal by explaining the "why" behind it. For example, do they want to go camping with their cookie proceeds? Or go to an amusement park?

Girl Scouts can use this DIY photo frame as a reminder of their "why" — and display it at booths!

Supplies:

- Palm-sized river rocks
- · Aluminum wire
- Index cards
- Scissors
- Pliers
- Markers

1 Encourage Girl Scouts to write their "why" on paper or an index card.
Cut a length of aluminum wire for them using pliers or scissors. (Note: An adult should complete this step, not Girl Scouts.) Bend the ends of the wire so they're not sharp.



Wrap the rock with wire then bend so wire is straight up. To make the clip, wrap your finger or other cylinder at least twice. Place the "why" in the clip.

Every correct answer earns them one step toward the finish line. Play until every Girl Scout reaches the finish line and is safety certified!



- 2. Flip over your frame. Decorate the front with <u>Cookie Clip Art</u> and use dry erase markers to write on the glass.



Money Management — Calculating Goals



Do the goal math

Help Girl Scouts calculate their package goals by first identifying what they want to do with their cookie proceeds.

Start with a brainstorming session, estimate the costs and let them do the math! This is a great time to discuss troop proceed tiers for total packages sold.

Make a list of ideas to help jump-start their brainstorming. Estimate the cost of activities and keep it easy by using \$5 increments. Examples: Go to the zoo for \$20; take ice skating lessons for \$30; make blankets for shelter dogs for \$30.
